²⁴ So Moses went out and told the people the LORD's words. He assembled seventy men from the people's elders and placed them around the tent. ²⁵ The LORD descended in a cloud, spoke to him, and took some of the spirit that was on him and placed it on the seventy elders. When the spirit rested on them, they prophesied, but only this once. ²⁶ Two men had remained in the camp, one named Eldad and the second named Medad, and the spirit rested on them. They were among those registered, but they hadn't gone out to the tent, so they prophesied in the camp. ²⁷ A young man ran and told Moses, "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp."

²⁸ Joshua, Nun's son and Moses' assistant since his youth, responded, "My master Moses, stop them!"

²⁹ Moses said to him, "Are you jealous for my sake? If only all the LORD's people were prophets with the LORD placing his spirit on them!" ³⁰ Moses and Israel's elders were assembled in the camp.

Numbers 11:24-30

I remember being a teenager and thinking about the Holy Spirit. It seemed so strange. I was not qualified. I was not "right with God." I was damaged. I was unworthy. I was gay, for cryin' out loud! I was not a member of the community of God's people, which at 17 years of age, looked something like Walton's Mountain to me. No, I was definitely not a part of the group, and I had been taught that it was only members of this elite Christian group that God would ever deem worthy for Their Spirit.

So how was it, then, that I had always felt the Holy Spirit with me, so close that sometimes I felt that all I needed do is reach out and I could touch Her. If I was unworthy, how did I feel filled with the Spirit every day? How can this be?

The answer is simple. God doesn't care what your opinion of yourself is. God knows who you *really* are: Their beloved child. God loves you and Their Holy Spirit is here with you right in this moment, ready to guide teach you. All you must do is be willing to receive Her. And then keep the ears of your heart open as She speaks.
